


# PLC learn Now

## WHAT IS A PLC?

- Professional Learning Community (PLC) is a network of individuals enabling the sharing and integration of collective knowledge, experiences, perspectives, attitudes, and practices.
- PLCs build knowledge and understanding, and inform the development of shared messaging, products and resources relevant to the eight priority goals outlined within the Comprehensive State Plan and the basis of the work of the Indiana Interagency Coordinating Council (IIACC).
- Each PLC has a curriculum aligned with one of these goals and informed by approximately:
  - 6 steering committee members**, representing professionals in content related to the PLC goal area and used to inform curriculum structure
  - 6 topical consultants**, representing professionals researching, practicing, and informing particular curriculum modules
  - 40 field-based liaisons**, representing professionals across disciplines and settings, who review curriculum materials and modules for their alignment with practice in the field.



## WHO CAN BE PART OF PLC?

- PLCs are flexible, dynamic, diverse, and inclusive of professionals across fields, settings, and experiences, as well as families, and individuals with ASD
- PLCs are welcoming to community members with interest and ability to actively participate in the specific topic represented by the chosen PLC.

## WHAT ARE THE EXPECTATIONS?

- Be open to learning, being innovative, and sharing experiences and insights!
- Review of materials, participation in live sessions and discussions, and building of resources and supports.
- Materials, resources, and opportunities for input will be accessible 24/7 to active members to share input, experiences and perspectives which will greatly inform products. While we envision live sessions with innovators and representatives from different fields to share their challenges and experiences, they can be viewed at any time. But be prepared to add your voice and insights to discussions, as your opinion will make a difference!
- Listen to and share feedback from the community within the PLC such that products are representative of the diverse needs.
- Share and disseminate the messaging and products across the community.
